Running Schedule: First dog on the line for the FIRST class will start as indicated each day with subsequent class start times **approximated**. **Note that both days start at 9:00 AM for the Standard ring and 9:30 AM for the Jumpers ring.** Times shown in the chart are approximate judging start times. **Be sure to get there early in case we are running ahead of schedule!** *Preliminary running order contingent on move-up entries not yet received.*

A workers schedule will be emailed to all volunteers. Jan Lentz will be the Chief Ring Steward (tervs4@verizon.net). She will be coordinating the final schedule at the trial and will also use the white board for sign-ups. If you can, please volunteer for the class(es) that you can help with. We will issue a \$5 coupon to each worker for each class worked that can be used either for lunch at the concession, or towards reduced fees at future PAC trials.

Crating: There is ample space for crating in this facility. The trial site will be available for set up Friday afternoon from noon onward. There is no charge for entering the fairgrounds for setup or day of show.

Measuring: All dogs that have not presented to the trial secretary a valid temporary or permanent height card will need to be measured prior to running in their first class, except dogs running at 24" and 26". Handlers whose dogs need to be measured will not be able to get their armbands until they are measured. We will have a judge available to measure dogs from 8 to 9 am each morning. We will have someone coordinating the measuring of dogs each morning.

Armbands: These will be available for pick up at the trial each morning. There is no formal check-in. Please check in with the gate steward prior to running in your class.

Walk-thrus: Open & novice classes will have one general walk-thru for all dogs. Excellent classes will have a split walk-thru: 4", 8", 12", & 16" dogs will walk together and then run. 20", 24", & 26" dogs will walk together & then run.

Move-ups: The deadline for move-ups is 6 pm, Monday, September 18, 2006, and must be in writing or email. Day-to-day move-ups will be permitted for Sunday runs.

Camping: All persons who requested and paid for camping will have their camping information, placard, and their dog's trial confirmation(s) mailed to them hard-copy. If you are camping without a prior registration, we will collect camping fees upon your arrival.

Please pick up after your dogs. There will be poop buckets, scoopers, and bags scattered about in the exercise areas.

Directions to the Fairgrounds: From North or South-bound I-5, take Exit #9, head west on 179th St. for about 0.5 miles, turn left onto 2nd Avenue, then left again at Gate 7. Exposition and Equestrian Bldg. is on the right, at the end of the road.
